Beverly Cleary School News

○ Students in grades 2-8 MAY wear **Halloween costumes** to school on October 30th. Students may not wear masks or bring weapons as part of their costumes. Our Kindergarten and 1st graders WILL NOT wear costumes.

○ **Another safety issue** that arises at the beginning of school is volunteer background checks. Please check with Rosanne or Kelly to determine if you have a current background check on file with the district. Background checks must be done prior to volunteering at school. Many parents at Beverly Cleary Fernwood Campus submitted the \$5.00 payment for the Volunteer Background Check when their status was good to volunteer for at least two years. They are good for three years. If you submitted payment and are already cleared for this year and next and would like to be reimbursed for the \$5.00 fee, please contact Rosanne at 503.916.6480 before November 2nd. Fees not claimed will be processed to help offset the cost for those that did not submit payment. Thanks to all our wonderful volunteers!

○ With the arrival of a huge number of sick students and teachers, **we have had an increasing number of requests for homework**. Our policy on make-up work may be found on page 4 of the Family Handbook. Since many teachers have class web pages, that can be your first resource for assignments your student may be missing. If there are no assignments and/or homework listed once the student returns, s/he should first ask the teacher for the missed assignments/homework or, less preferred, if there are no assignments/homework posted on a teacher web page, you may e-mail the teacher, but requests will not be filled for 24 hrs.

○ **Please make sure your child's plans for after school are solidified before s/he leaves for school in the morning.** It is often difficult for the office to relay changes in plans to the teachers before the end of the day. We understand emergencies can present themselves during the day, but we ask for plans to be made before the student arrives at school so that calls to school will be limited.

○ **If your student forgets a lunch, instrument, homework, etc. please take it to the office.** We will call the classroom to inform the student the item is in the office. This procedure reduces the distractions that result when a parent walks into a classroom. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

○ On Wednesday November 11, 2009 **the annual Veteran's Day Parade will be held**. The parade begins at 9:00 a.m., with the route through the Hollyrood district. Last year,

students received service hours for waving flags along the parade route. If a 5th - 8th grade student does so again this year, s/he may report the hours to their health teacher for service credit.

○ **Get Students Walking and Biking to School**

In 1969, 42 percent of students walked or biked to school, today less than 16 percent of students between the ages of 5 and 15 walk to school.¹ At Safe Routes to School, we are working to increase the number of children walking and biking to school. By improving safety conditions and educating children on bicycle and pedestrian safety, we can create the best conditions for children to make healthier decisions.

We are currently looking for school volunteers to organize walking and biking activities at our school. Safe Routes provides trainings, incentives and other resources to help you get students walking and biking to school. We can help you organize a Walking School Bus, Bike Train, a walk and bike day or start a Stop + Walk program. ○ **Please encourage your child to lock his/her bike/scooter if s/he leaves it at school during the day.**

○ In the last newsletter Teri mentioned the importance of **bikers being mindful of safety** as they approach the school. Bike riders were asked to walk their bikes within a block of the school buildings. Bike riders as well as pedestrians are also cautioned not to enter the portion of the driveway in the back of the Fernwood campus that is designated as "Exit Only." We have had a few "near misses" with cars and individuals walking and riding their bikes.

• **New Cafeteria Policy on Milk Substitutions to start on November 9th**

PPS schools must implement a new policy from the USDA (United States Department of Agriculture) and ODE Child Nutrition (Oregon Department of Education) which states that juice may not be offered as a milk substitute. Currently there is no approved milk substitute available in Oregon. Students will not be required to take milk when they purchase lunch, if they do not drink milk. Students who do not want milk may choose from the other food groups offered to select at least three food groups.

As of November 9th, milk will be the only a la carte beverage sold in the K-5 and K-8 cafeterias. Juice will not be an option at lunch in order to encourage students to limit juice intake and eat more whole fruits as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics. ○ **You may have heard at Back to School night** that Beverly Cleary has made some changes in our practices this year. As we grow into a stronger K-8, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our program. This year we are implementing Walk to Read at grades 1-3. First and third grade have already started Walk to Read and second grade will begin soon. This is a way to group students to ensure that we are meeting their rate and level in reading. Another class that started in late September is the fifth and sixth grade Beginning Band. At this point we have over 40 students enrolled in band! ○ Speaking of walking, **we are looking for parent volunteers to help with Safety Patrol** before (8:25-8:45) and after (2:55-3:15) school. At this point Doug McMahon, Angela McMahon and Victor Gonzalez have been on duty nearly every day. We need more parents to help out. If we don't have adults, we will not send students out to patrol the crosswalk alone. Our goal is to keep all our kids safe and to provide one crosswalk that is monitored for families to cross 33rd safely. Beverly Cleary School TAG News

Important Dates for TAG

October 20th, 2009 – All Beverly Cleary second grade students will be given the NNAT screening test. This is a non-verbal screening instrument for possible TAG identification. Since this assessment does not screen for reading or math, parents and teachers will still need to make nominations.

November 23rd, 2009 – Deadline for TAG Identification Process Forms (IDPF) to be submitted to schools. These nomination forms may be submitted by a teacher or a parent and can be found in the main office.

January 2010 – Testing will be scheduled by the district TAG office. School teams have two weeks after testing to meet with their Leadership team and make recommendations.

February 2010 – PPS sends a notification letter to families approximately 30 days after testing.

Genres include: Adventure, Animal Stories, Fantasy/Science Fiction, Historical Fiction, Mystery, and Realistic Fiction.
