By the time you receive this newsletter, October will be pretty much over, which means in one more short month, the school year will be one-third complete. It is such a pleasure for me to be able to note the academic growth in our students even in the two months we've been in session. Our dedicated and hard working teaching and support staff have high expectations for our students' academic, behavioral and social emotional growth and students rise to those expectations in a variety of ways that make it easy for the observer to see.

One of the ways our staff facilitates the growth in our students is by improving their own practice through professional development at the building level and by taking classes on their own. As you may already know, the District has asked all schools to focus on the teaching of writing this year. Not unlike the majority of other schools in the District, Beverly Cleary's writing scores lag behind those in reading and math. To date, teachers have spent time individually and as grade level and content area teams developing curriculum maps, which lay out the teaching of writing for the year. At our Monday staff meetings and at the Wednesday late openings, we will be looking at the maps within and across grade levels to facilitate a K-8 plan for how we teach writing at Beverly Cleary. Teachers will be looking at commonalities in their maps across grade levels and aligning them with each other. Using the data from last winter's fourth and seventh grade Direct Writing Assessments, they have been analyzing data to determine a teaching focus for this year. Similarly, they will be scoring papers and discussing student work using writing generated, to date and in the second and third trimesters.

I always look forward to visiting with parents and hope you will join me at our first trimester "Coffee Chat" on November 10th on the Hollyrood campus and November 18th on the Fernwood campus. I will be talking about conferences and what you can expect from them.

As we approach what seems like the shortest month of the year, we find families taking vacations since there are so many days without school because of Veteran's Day, conferences and Thanksgiving. In the last Family Newsletter, we talked about our policy regarding homework requests during or after illness. Although we see an increase in the number of absences due to vacations in November with a corresponding increase in

requests for homework, irrespective of the time of the year our homework policy states that teachers do not prepare homework for absences due to vacations.

Last week, we had an unfortunate incident of a student getting hurt on the playground after school. As you have undoubtedly noted in our Parent and Student Handbook, students K-5 must be released to an adult and 6th, 7th and 8th grade students are expected to go directly home after dismissal. The older students often think they can play first and then go home, but we expect them to go straight home since we have no supervision on the playground after school hours. Please remind your 6th-8th grade students of this safety rule.

Many of you have heard me say I am an advocate for the arts and that I desire to support their integration into their curriculum. Our third and fourth graders are currently learning songs for their musical productions that will be held in February and March. Both of these programs reinforce third graders' study of the history of Portland, and fourth graders' study of Oregon history. I can hardly wait to see them perform. Our 6th, 7th and 8th graders will have the opportunity to try out for parts in "Ramona Quimby" in December. Rehearsals will be held beginning later in December and will continue through January and February with a performance in late February. All three of these productions will require parent help, so I feel fortunate to have a parent community that will help bring the productions to fruition. If you have a student in these grades, I hope you will encourage him/her to try out for the play. I would also like to make you aware that we are able to offer these opportunities as well as a number of others, which we will point out as the year goes along, because of the success of our Run-For-The-Arts last spring.

Thank you for your ongoing support of the partnership we have with each other as we continue to relish in the wonderful experience your children are having at Beverly Cleary.

Beverly Cleary School News

- District policy requires parents and any other visitor/volunteer to check in at the office when they visit school. We have had an unusually large number of parents walk to their child's classroom without checking in at the office, which is quite disruptive to the teaching environment. We know kids forget lunches, homework, permission slips, instruments and other items, but we ask that you bring the "forgotten" items to the office. We will get them to the student or we will call the student down to the office if it's an emergency and you need to speak with him/her. Thank you for helping us reduce the distractions that result when parents fail to check in at the office.

- On Wednesday November 11, 2009, the **Annual Veteran's Day Parade** will be held. The parade begins at 9:00 a.m., with the route through the Hollywood district. Last year, students received service hours for waving flags along the parade route. If a 5th - 8th grade student does so again this year, s/he may report the hours to their health teacher for service credit.

- **Background checks** must be done prior to volunteering at school. Please check with Rosanne or Kelly to determine if you have a current background check on file with the district. Cleared status is good for three years. Thanks to all our wonderful volunteers!

- **Homework**-With the arrival of a huge number of sick students and teachers, we have had an increasing number of requests for homework. Our policy on make-up work may be found on page 4 of the Family Handbook. Since many teachers have class web pages that can be your first resource for assignments your student may be missing. If there are no assignments and/or homework listed once the student returns, s/he should first ask the teacher for the missed assignments/homework or, less preferred, if there are no assignments/homework posted on a teacher web page, you may e-mail the teacher, but requests will not be filled for 24 hrs.

- **Daily Plans**-Please make sure your child's plans for after school are solidified before s/he leaves for school in the morning. It is often difficult for the office to relay changes in plans to the teachers before the end of the day. We understand emergencies can present themselves during the day, but we ask for plans to be made before the student arrives at school so that calls to school will be limited.

- **Get Students Walking and Biking to School**
In 1969, 42 percent of students walked or biked to school, today less than 16 percent of students between the ages of 5 and 15 walk to school. By improving safety conditions and educating children on bicycle and pedestrian safety, we can create the best conditions for children to make healthier decisions.

We are currently looking for school volunteers to organize walking and biking activities at your school. Safe Routes provides trainings, incentives and other resources to help you get students walking and biking to school. We can help you organize a Walking School Bus, Bike Train, a walk and bike day or start a Stop + Walk program. - **Bicycle Locks**-Please encourage your child to lock his/her bike/scooter if s/he leaves it at school during the day.
- **Bike Safety**-In the last newsletter Teri mentioned the importance of bikers being mindful of safety as they approach the school. Bike riders were asked to walk their bikes within a block of the school buildings. Bike riders as well as pedestrians are also cautioned not to enter the portion of the driveway in the back of the Fernwood campus that is designated as "Exit Only." We have had a few "near misses" with cars and individuals walking and riding their bikes.

- **New Cafeteria Policy on Milk Substitutions to start on November 9th**-PPS schools must implement a new policy from the USDA (United States Department of Agriculture) and ODE Child Nutrition (Oregon Department of Education) which states that juice may not be offered as a milk substitute. Currently there is no approved milk substitute available in Oregon. Students will not be required to take milk when they purchase lunch, if they do not drink milk. Students who do not want milk may choose from the other food groups offered to select at least three food groups.

As of November 9th, milk will be the only a la carte beverage sold in the K-5 and K-9 cafeterias. Juice will not be an option at lunch in order to encourage students to limit juice intake and eat more whole fruits as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics. There is no limitation on beverages sent from home. Contact Shannon Stember at 503.916.3365 if you have questions.

This year, students will have the opportunity to explore the world through a **geography program called The Passport Club**. Each child who participates will receive a passport, choose their individual level of study and collect postage stamps as they learn some or all the world's countries over the course of the school year.

The program thrives on parent volunteers so please consider giving us a hand. We are looking for **12** volunteer "checkers" from 1:00-3:00 on the 3rd Friday every month. "Checkers" listen as the students point to countries they have learned that month. Parents find this experience rewarding, and most appreciate learning current geography right along with their children.

On the back of the "monthly study map" you'll find an explanation of the Passport Club levels. This will help you discuss with your child which level they would be most interested in learning about. Additionally, very soon your child will receive some reference and study maps and a passport (that stays in the classroom).
